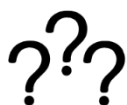


Context:

Questions and Answers



Thank you for letting us visit your school.
We enjoyed meeting you and learning about your Enterprises.

You asked us lots of great questions.
Here are the answers.



1. What does adult respite offer? How does the funding work?



Needs Assessment – looks at what support you need.



Care and Support Plan – shows how you will get that support.



Carers Assessment – carers (like parents) talk about the support they give and when they need a break. You and your carer should agree a plan for if they can't look after you.



Respite (Replacement Care) might be:

- going to a respite place

- extra help at home

In an emergency: you go to the place with spaces that can support you.



2. Do services need to report their progress on the outcomes?

✓ Yes.



This was discussed at the SEND and AP Committee meeting in January.



We are making ways to measure progress.



Voices United (young people) will help.



Updates will be shared at future Committee meetings.



3. Can you increase access to work experience?



The Skills and Employability team helps schools meet employers.



Careers Leaders should speak to their **Enterprise Coordinator**.



The Coordinator finds gaps, connects schools with employers, and supports planning.

4. Can you provide support or funding to PODS Disco?



Adam: The Council **cannot** directly give money.



But there is a **Community Wellbeing Grant** that might help.



Adam will talk to Public Health about whether the grant could support the Disco.



5. I can't use my bus pass before 9.30am. Can you help?



First, talk to staff at school.



If needed, speak to your EHCP Coordinator or social worker.



If no solution is found, contact Adam. He will try to help.



6. Can you make gyms more accessible?



Adam is talking to Public Health about this.



The Council cannot force gyms to change.



But they can encourage gyms to improve accessibility.



Gyms that improve will be celebrated publicly.



Your school could also talk to a local gym about how you could help.



7. Safe Places National Network



Someone noticed Worcester had no Safe Places listed on the national map.



There *are* Safe Places in Worcestershire, run by **Our Way**.



You could help share information so other young people know how Safe Places work.



8. Can you add Widgets to the website?



We asked the webpage team.



They say it might be possible.



We will test this on the Co-production pages first.



Many pages already have Easy Read options.



9. What inclusive sports are in Worcestershire?



Some inclusive sports are already on the Local Offer.



We need to add more.



The Local Offer webpages are being redesigned.



Matteo from Voices United is helping.



A new officer will be hired to keep the information up to date.



Young people at Wyre Forest School will be told about updates.
