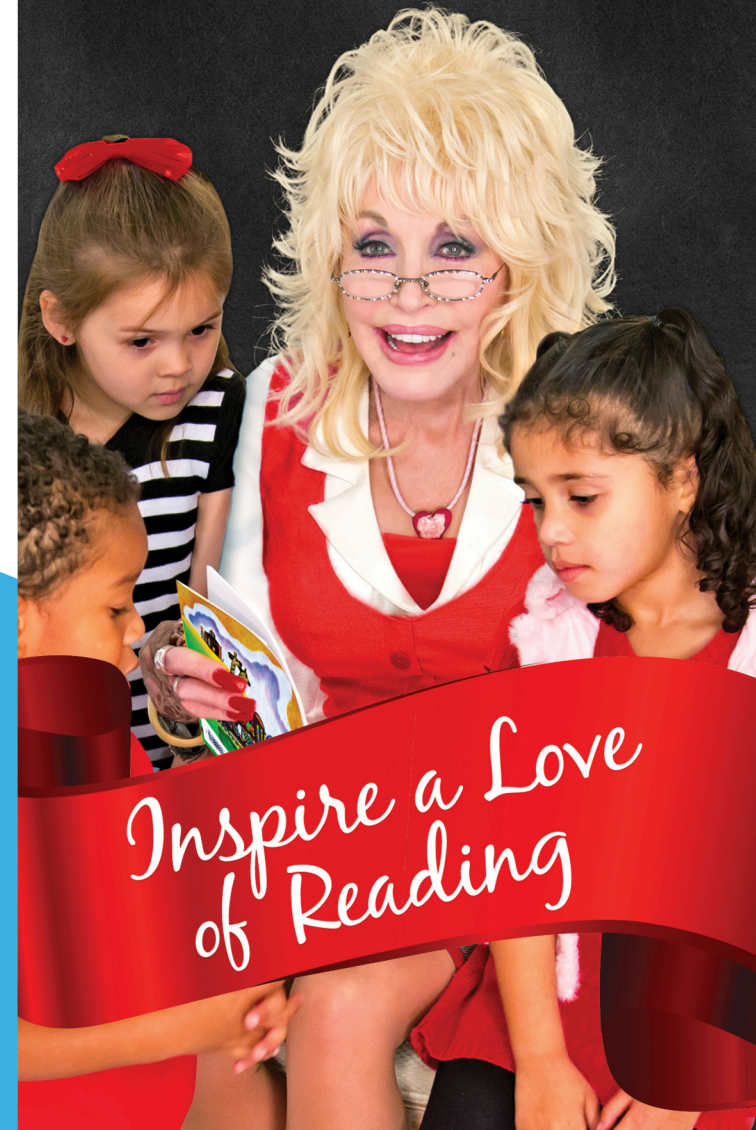

## Welcome to Dolly Parton's Imagination Library

All children enrolled in the Imagination Library receive a book in the post every month until their fifth birthday.

Every book is personally addressed to the child. All titles in the Imagination Library are published by Penguin Random House and carefully selected by a panel of experts in early childhood literacy and reading.

## A free programme

The Dollywood Foundation UK works with national and local funders and other charities to fund this programme. Dolly, through her Foundation, contributes as well. Here in Worcestershire, this is supported by the charity Make My Day Better, plus other donors. This means it is free for the children receiving the books.

## A love of books and reading

Reading and encouraging a love of books is one of the best things we can do for our children. Book sharing with a child encourages bonding and development of language, communication and cognitive skills. Children can find snuggling up with a grown up and a book very comforting. Books are a fuel for a child's imagination!

## Dolly's charity

Dolly set up the first Imagination Library in 1995 in her hometown in Tennessee, USA. Since then, the Imagination Library has come to the UK with more than 50,000 children receiving a book every month!

## Our programme in Worcestershire

This programme is for Worcestershire County Council children who are in care, and is administered by the Virtual School. We hope to include all the children we work with who are aged under 5.
